I met her at a Compassionate Friends meeting. She was so real and down to earth; it was so easy to connect with her. Flo lost 2 adult children. Her attendance at our meetings was a true tribute to the children she lost. Her attendance also validated to us bereaved moms, dads, etc., that our children would always be remembered years after they left us. Flo was a true testimony to this. As a veteran of grief, she generously gave her time and led us newly bereaved down the thorny path of life after our loss. She never rushed us or became bored with us; she understood us. She was her own person-very honest and outspoken. Her honesty and sense of humor were such a delightful part of her personality. Most of all, I remember Flo as a very loving, compassionate person. 
